**Dear Colleagues,**

I write to keep you informed about two matters, and to mention our ongoing Senate election.

### **1. Pensions**

The Academic Assembly of the Academic Senate (the systemwide equivalent of the Faculty Legislature) passed a resolution regarding the changes in the UC pension plan. Academic Council has also sent a letter to President Napolitano based on comments from all ten campuses about the introduction of the new 2016 Pension tier. ### **2. Cybersecurity**

UC Berkeley faculty voiced concerns about cyber monitoring at the UC, particularly the monitoring which had been introduced in August 2015, after the cyber breach at UCLA a few months earlier. On February 1, 2016, a letter from UC Executive Vice President and Chief Operating Officer Rachael Nava was distributed to faculty and staff of all ten UC campuses that spoke to the concerns of the Berkeley faculty. The concerns of the UCB faculty center on issues of consultation regarding cyber monitoring, as well as issues of transparency, including where the monitored data is stored, for how long, and related matters.
